The IEDC is excited to announce that applications for the 2026 Community Collaboration Fund are now open! CCF is designed to spark new collaborations between Indiana-based Entrepreneur Support Organizations (ESOs) to strengthen the state's entrepreneurial ecosystem and fill critical service gaps.

Eligible projects may focus on entrepreneur education, tech enablement, or acceleration, and awards range from \$5,000 to \$40,000.

To apply, organizations must provide a 25% match (15% cash / 10% in-kind) and propose a new or expanded initiative that directly supports Hoosier entrepreneurs.

Closes: March 2, 2026 (11:59 PM ET)

📌 Eligible Applicants Include:

- Indiana-based nonprofits
- Academic institutions
- Native American tribes
- Local & regional governments
- Networks/associations (For-profit entities are not eligible.)

📌 Project Requirements:

- Must involve two or more Indiana ESOs with one lead ESO
 - Must be completed by June 30, 2027
- Must include a line-item budget, budget narrative, and letters of support
 - Must provide direct entrepreneur support
- Must be reimbursement-based with verifiable documentation

Indiana Arts Commission accepting applications for Arts Project Support grant program

(INDIANAPOLIS) The Indiana Arts Commission (IAC) and its Regional Arts Partners announced today the opening of applications for the Fiscal Year 2027 Spring Arts Project Support grant program.

Arts Project Support grants provide nonprofit organizations and public entities with funding to support a specific arts activity, such as a one-time event, a single production, an exhibition, an educational workshop, or a series of related arts activities such as art classes or training sessions. Applications are accepted twice per year, with organizations eligible to receive one grant award per fiscal year.

The purpose of the program is to provide broad access to arts opportunities throughout the state. Applicants may request up to \$4,000 to support their project, and there is no match requirement. Projects must occur between July 1, 2026 and June 30, 2027 to be eligible for FY27 Spring Arts Project Support.

"Arts Project Support grants provide Indiana communities with an opportunity to increase the quality of life and quality of place for local residents," said Miah Michaelsen, IAC Executive Director. "Arts and creativity are a community and economic development driver, and we are proud to support Hoosiers who are working to making Indiana a better place to live, work, study, and stay through the arts."

Applications for the Arts Project Support program are reviewed and scored by members of the public.

Reviewers play a significant role in application evaluation for public funding by reviewing, scoring, and providing comments on submitted applications. [Learn more about serving as a grant reviewer and submit an interest form.](#)

Arts Commission Announces Creative Aging Summit (INDIANAPOLIS) The Indiana Arts Commission (IAC), in partnership with the Ulndy Center for Aging & Community (Ulndy CAC), is excited to announce the Lifelong Arts Indiana Creative Aging Summit on March 23, 2026 at the University of Indianapolis campus in Indianapolis, Indiana.

This free, one-day in-person learning opportunity will bring together aging service providers, libraries, communities and arts organizations, as well as artists and experts on creative aging around supporting the expansion of arts learning for older adults in Indiana. The convening will offer learning, networking, and resources to anyone interested in providing arts experiences to older adults using the Lifelong Arts Indiana model.

Lifelong Arts Indiana, a multi-year initiative of the IAC, is designed to bring evidence-based participatory arts programming to older adults across Indiana to improve health and wellbeing outcomes through best-practices trainings and funded residencies. Research on the programming revealed that the Lifelong Arts Indiana model improved the mental and physical health of older adults, created meaningful employment opportunities for artists, and created sustainable community partnerships.

"Lifelong Arts Indiana has been a multi-year effort from our agency and partners to improve health outcomes and reduce social isolation among older Hoosiers through art and creativity," said Miah Michaelsen, Executive Director of the Indiana Arts Commission. "We are grateful for the opportunity to share the impact and importance of this work and to help encourage its utilization across Indiana and beyond."

BEAD Update



As you may know, Indiana's Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) awards have been approved by the federal government and all awardees have received next steps from the Indiana Broadband Office.

The IBO has requested required pre-execution documentation, including updated GIS files, before we can begin subgrant agreements within the next month. Remember, all information must be submitted to the IBO via

IndianaBroadband@iot.in.gov as soon as

possible. As we approach contract execution, internet service providers have submitted redlines, comments and revision requests to the IBO Subgrant Agreement. To ensure contracts are executed within the federally-mandated deadline, the window to submit is now closed. We appreciate your time and effort in sending these to our office. Also, you may have received an email from our IBO Permitting Liaison William Hollis regarding your submitted EHP/NEPA milestones. Please respond to him as soon as possible so we can make sure everything we need is accurate and updated before we sign subgrant agreements.

Coming Soon: The IBO is also excited to announce that an insurance expert will be joining the team to answer all questions regarding insurance, including your questions about the Certificate of Insurance, etc.

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DNR Water Stakeholder Input Workshops

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources is inviting stakeholders to participate in a series of water planning workshops across the state.

The purpose of the workshops is to collect stakeholder input, ideas, and information to help inform the development of a statewide water inventory and management plan under Governor Braun's Executive Order 25-63: Statewide water inventory and management plan.

Attendees will be updated on the progress of the effort. They will be asked for input on developing a regional water planning framework, enhancing Indiana's water monitoring networks, and creating an online water data and management platform.

We have received our purchase order (PO) from INDOT and will be beginning traffic counts in Franklin and Decatur Counties. In addition, INDOT has authorized 10 courtesy counts per county, with the exception of counties covered by a Metropolitan Planning Organization (Dearborn and Shelby).

The Special Count Program—covering both state-owned and non-state-owned roads—is currently underway in all counties except Shelby. This program operates under a three-year contract that runs through December 2026.

Traffic count data for your area is available on the INDOT website at <http://indot.ms2soft.com>. To access the data, enter the portal and select TCDS, where counts can be searched by county, roadway, or location ID. Staff assistance is available if you need help navigating the system.

As part of our ongoing coordination with INDOT, we encourage you to share any traffic-related information regarding local or state coordination, active transportation needs, or safety concerns. This information can be submitted to INDOT during our Annual Planning Meeting to help inform future planning efforts.
